### RN to BSN Clinical Practicum

Within the RN to BSN Nursing Program, nursing students have the opportunity to integrate into the baccalaureate nursing role in a leadership and public/community health setting through the Clinical Practicum course. This course is designed with a one-to-one ratio, so each student has a nurse preceptor for the duration of the community health clinical experience, as well as the leadership experience. This leads to the maturation of the nursing student into the role of the BSN nurse. The preceptor is a role model, educator, and facilitator for the SMSU nursing students. This spring, 16 local and regional healthcare agencies partnered with the RN to BSN Nursing Program to provide preceptors for nursing students in a variety of settings. This learning opportunity provides tremendous benefits to both the healthcare agencies and the nursing students, impacting southwest Minnesota and the wider world.

## Avera Marshall Nursing Scholarship

SMSU is pleased to announce the *Avera Marshall Nursing Scholarship*, which has been established through an Avera Marshall donation to the SMSU Foundation.
