

Scholarships for Continuing SMSU Undergraduate Students



SCHOLARSHIPS for Southwest Minnesota State University students are made possible by financial contributions received from alumni, businesses, foundations and other friends of the institution. Qualifications and eligibility requirements for scholarships vary. This brochure provides a summary of scholarships available to continuing SMSU Students.

Students who receive scholarships are strongly encouraged to write a thank-you letter to the individual, business or organization funding the award. Donors want to know that their money is being used to further the educational endeavors of their scholarship recipients.

ACADEMIC SCHOLARSHIPS ACCOUNTING

Accounting Program Scholarship — Awarded to selected juniors who are declared Accounting majors. Awarded during spring semester. Award to be determined. Contact the Accounting Program for further information.

Accounting Club Scholarship — Awarded to declared Accounting majors with 96 credits or more (at least 30 of those at SMSU). Must be at intermediate accounting level and must be a member of the Accounting Club. Awarded each spring. Award varies. Contact the Accounting Club.

Mark Edelmann Scholarship — Applicants must be sophomore or junior standing by fall semester, have a grade point average of 2.7 or higher and be majoring in Business Administration, Accounting, Marketing, Agribusiness, or Computer Science. The recipient must have provided leadership and been actively involved in improving the quality of life within a community and/or campus activities through volunteered services. Sophomores may reapply as juniors. Scholarship is based upon financial need. Contact the Department Office.

Deeann Griebel Endowed Scholarship — Applicants must be junior or senior accounting majors. Students must be active in accounting department/club activities and show outstanding academic performance. Preference is given to students with financial need. Minimum award of \$1,500. Contact the Accounting Department for more information.

AGRIBUSINESS

Brian Schmiesing Agribusiness/Agronomy Fund — Scholarships are awarded to students who are members of the Agribusiness/Agronomy Club. Contact club advisor.

CHS Foundation Cooperative Development Scholarship; East River Electric Power Cooperative; Basim Electric Power Cooperative; and Friends of the Cooperative Development Scholarship — Awarded to incoming freshmen and upperclass students interested in agribusiness and cooperative organizations. Recipients must show academic and leadership potential and promise for significant contributions to co-op organizations. Not based on financial need. Renewable. Annual award: \$300 to \$750. Applications available at the Agribusiness Program.

Mark Edelmann Scholarship — See Accounting Scholarship Listing

Camiel G. Maes Memorial Scholarship — Recipients must be full-time students majoring in agribusiness at SMSU. Preference given to a student with a Ghent, MN address. Financial need is not a factor. Contact the Agribusiness Program.

ART

Con and Marcy Eckstrom Family Scholarship — Recipients must be majoring in Art Education or Physical Education. Awarded to sophomore, junior or senior students who are enrolled full-time. Based on academic and leadership performance. Not renewable. Minimum award of \$500. Contact the Art Department.

Fine Arts Gala Scholarship — Recipients shall major in one of the following areas: art, speech communication, theatre and creative writing. Recipient will be selected on the basis of academic performance and participation in department/program activities. Students must be of at least sophomore standing and are required to participate in the Gala Ball Activities. Financial need not be a factor. Contact the appropriate department listed above for applications.

BUSINESS ADMINISTRATION

James Babcock Memorial Scholarship — Selection is based on academic success and leadership ability. Student must be majoring in business administration, have completed at least two semesters of study at SMSU, and have a minimum GPA of 3.0. Minimum award of \$500. Renewable for up to three years. Contact the Business Administration Program.

Business Administration Scholarship — Recipients shall be freshmen or upperclassmen at SMSU who are Business Administration or Pre-Business Majors. Students must be enrolled full-time and must have a cumulative grade point average of 3.0 or better. Award varies. Contact Business Administration Program.

Mark Edelmann Scholarship — See Accounting Scholarship Listing.

Thomas and Linda Sanders Endowed Scholarship — Recipients shall be students who have completed at least two semesters at SMSU, are majoring in Business Administration, maintain a minimum grade point average of 3.0 and have financial need. The scholarship is renewable. Minimum award of \$500. Contact Business Administration Program.

Upper Midwest Employers Association Scholarship — Full-time junior level students majoring in a business-related field who have a minimum grade point average of 2.8 are eligible for this scholarship. Preference will be given to a student from the 19-county service region of SMSU. A letter of application describing how the student will use their education to give back to SW MN upon graduation is required. This is a renewable scholarship. Minimum award \$1,000. Contact Business and Public Affairs.

COMPUTER SCIENCE/MATH/SCIENCE

Abacus Scholarship — Awarded to new and continuing students based on interest in Mathematics and/or Computer Science. Student must show performance and a potential to succeed in the chosen major area. A recommendation of faculty is also required. Students maintaining a 3.0 may reapply for scholarship. Award to be determined. Awards will be announced in the spring. Contact the Mathematics and Computer Science Program.

Chemistry Memorial Scholarship — Must be a Chemistry major who is enrolled full-time. New and continuing students eligible. 1-year award. Amount varies. Application deadline announced during spring semester each year. Contact Chemistry Program.

Mark Edelmann Scholarship — See Accounting Scholarship Listing.

Mortier Family Endowed Scholarship — Recipients must be at least junior standing majoring in a science-related field. Awarded to students who have not received scholarships to date. Minimum of 3.0 GPA required. Preference given to students from the 19-county service region of SMSU. Letter of application describing how the student will use their education to give back to Southwest MN upon graduation. Minimum award of \$500. Contact the Science Department.

Ann C Peters Scholarship — This scholarship will be awarded to a junior full-time student of good character, need and high academic standing. GPA of 3.0 or better required. Mathematics majors and/or students working toward an elementary education major with a math minor are eligible. Renewable. Award \$500 to \$800. Contact Mathematics Department.

Randall J and Jean S Replinger Award for Excellence in Environmental Science — Seniors with an Environmental Science major and demonstrated academic excellence are eligible for this award. Student must show superior performance in designing, conducting and presenting an independent research project. Presentation must be made at SMSU Undergraduate Research Conference and to the local community. Not renewable. Minimum award of \$500. Contact Environmental Science Faculty.

Schwan's Computer Science Scholarship and Assistantship — Full-time students with a declared major or minor in Computer Science are eligible for this award. Recipient must be of at least junior status at the beginning of fall semester and have a minimum cumulative GPA of 3.0. Assistantships must work with members of the department on projects directly related to teaching and scholarly pursuits. Renewal for up to two years. Student must reapply. Contact the Computer Science Program.

Science, Mathematics and Computer Science Scholarship — Awarded to continuing students based on scholarly potential, past performance, extracurricular activities, personal characteristics, etc. Not renewable. Award to be determined. Application deadline announced during spring semester each year. Contact the Science, Mathematics, and Computer Science Program.

John Thomas Memorial Scholarship — Recipients must be juniors or seniors majoring in Chemistry. This is a 1-year award. Award varies. Application deadline announced during spring semester each year. Contact Chairperson of Chemistry Program.

Dr. Gordon S. and Helen Wands Scholarship — Scholarship awarded to a fourth year student majoring in Biology, Chemistry, Pre-Med, Pre-Optometry or a related field with an intent to enter a health care profession. Preference given to students from the Marshall area. Not renewable. Minimum award of \$500. Contact the Science Department.

EDUCATION

Carr Properties Endowment — Recipients of the scholarship must major in the area of Education. Selection based on academic performance and demonstrated leadership ability. Financial need not a factor. Minimum award of \$300. Contact Education Department.

Kelsey Eberle Memorial Scholarship

This scholarship is awarded to a full-time junior who is seeking an Education major. The award will be based on academic and leadership performance. Financial need is not a factor. Minimum award of \$500. Contact Education Department.

Con and Marcy Eckstrom Family Scholarship — See Art Scholarship Listing

Geneva Emblem Education Scholarship — Education majors are eligible for this scholarship. Selection is based on academic performance and demonstrated leadership ability as determined by the SMSU Education Department faculty. Financial need is not a factor. Preference to full-time students. Minimum award of \$300. Contact Education Department.

Golden Rule Scholarship in Elementary Education — Recipients are women in their senior year of college majoring in elementary education. Students must be responsible, academically productive, and show an enthusiasm in working with children. Selection based on financial need. One-year, non-renewable award. Award varies. Contact Education Department.

Keigh Hubel Rural Education Scholarship — Awarded to a Junior or Senior majoring in Education. A letter of application describing the ways the student will demonstrate the potential to serve rural schools is required. Preference is given to full time students. Financial need is not a factor. Not renewable. Minimum award of \$250. Contact the Education Department.

Robert Schwerin Memorial Scholarship — Awarded to senior education majors from the Midwest with a grade point average of 3.0 or higher. The recipient will have demonstrated good citizenship through their active involvement in the SMSU academic community and will be of high moral standards. Financial need is not a factor. Preference will be given to full-time students. Contact the Education Department.

ENGLISH

Alec Bond Scholarship — Students enrolled in English 102 or 103 will be considered for this scholarship. Demonstrated writing ability will be evaluated by the English Department. Not renewable. Minimum award of \$50. Contact the English Department.

Leo Dangel Creative Writing and Literature Scholarship — Awarded to an academically outstanding student in Creative Writing or Literature. To be eligible an applicant must have completed at least one creative writing course at SMSU. Junior or senior status required. Not renewable. Award to be determined. Contact the English Department for further information.

Fine Arts Gala Scholarship— See Art Scholarship Listing.

Mary and Jack Hickerson Endowed Scholarship — Non-traditional students, as defined by the University Catalog, are eligible for this award. Students must be enrolled full-time, be of junior standing and be majoring in the arts and/or humanities with a preference given to English majors. Minimum award of \$500. Contact Chair of English Department.

Walter L. Mann Memorial Scholarship — Awarded to an employee of the SMSU Writing Center with a minimum GPA of 3.0. Renewable for up to four years. Must re-apply. Minimum award of \$100. Contact the English Department.

William Whipple Arts and Humanities Scholarship — Awarded to academically outstanding juniors and seniors majoring in art, music, theatre, English, philosophy and/or foreign language. Not renewable. Contact the Humanities Program for further information.

GLOBAL STUDIES

Global Studies Scholarship — Applicants must be full-time students at SMSU and be accepted as a cluster participant. Preference will be given to freshmen students with ACT scores of 21 or above or who are ranked in the top one-third of their high school class; sophomores, juniors, or seniors with a cumulative GPA of 2.75 or above; rural or first-generation college students; students who demonstrate leadership skills or potential. Financial need is not a factor. Maximum award of \$500. Contact Global Studies Program.

Rural Leaders for a Global Tomorrow — Recipient must be a full-time student with less than 48 credits and come from a rural community of less than 25,000. Preference will be given to first generation college students and from Minnesota, North Dakota, or Wisconsin. Must have an ACT score of 22 or above, or be in the top 25% of the high school graduating class. Financial need is not a factor. Award of \$500. Contact Global Studies Program.

HEALTH AND PHYSICAL EDUCATION

Con and Marcy Eckstrom Family Scholarship — See Art Scholarship Listing.

Wellness and Human Performance Annual Scholarship—Students who have declared a major in WHP and are junior standing will be eligible for this scholarship. Recipient must be active in the WHP club and have a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.5. Three recommendations are required, with one of those coming from the student's advisor. Applications must be completed by April 1 of sophomore year. Minimum award of \$250. Contact WHP Department.

HISTORY

Ethel and Joseph Amato, Sr. Memorial Scholarship — This scholarship will be awarded to a full-time junior or senior with a cumulative GPA of 2.75 or above, majoring in History, Political Science, Pre-law or one of the other social sciences who is interested and perhaps has already shown his or her interest in public service, teaching, labor unions, or co-ops. Minimum award of \$100. Contact the History Program.

Maynard F. Brass Memorial Scholarship — Applicant must possess a 3.0 grade point average and be enrolled in 12 or more credit hours per semester. Not renewable. This is a merit scholarship. Not based on financial need. Award varies. Contact History Program.

History Scholarship — Scholarships are awarded to students who have demonstrated aptitude and interest in History. Department will review applications. Award varies. Contact History Program.

Catherine I. McNally Scholarship — Awarded to the Outstanding Student of the Year, majoring in history with a minimum of 3.3 grade point average. The applicant must submit a history paper they have written in any history class. Financial need is not a factor. Minimum award \$300. Contact History Program.

Nick Roberts Memorial Scholarship — Juniors or Seniors who are majoring in History or Psychology are eligible for this award. Based on academic performance and demonstrated writing ability. Must demonstrate financial need. Not renewable. Minimum award of \$500. Contact Social Science Department.

Perryman-Visser Award — This award is made to the SMSU student who produces the best paper on Southwest Minnesota in the history seminar. A completed paper must be submitted by September 15. Financial need is not a factor. Award of \$100-\$300. Contact the History Department for additional criteria.

LEARNING RESOURCES

Trio Scholarships of the Learning Resources Department — Awarded to students who have been served by the Learning Resources Department. They must be first generation, low income and/or disabled. Award is \$100 to \$500. Contact Learning Resources Department.

MARKETING

Mark Edelmann Scholarship — See Accounting Scholarship Listing.

MUSIC

Artus Musica Scholarship — Recipients are selected on the basis of superior performance capability: satisfactory work in all academic areas evidenced by transcript satisfactory ACT and PSAT scores; and a record of active participation in and enthusiastic support of musical activities and performances at his/her high school, college/university, and/or SMSU. Awarded to students enrolled full-time or part-time, and may be either music majors, music minors or non-music majors. Award to be determined. Contact Music Program.

Gala Music Scholarship — Recipients are selected on the basis of superior performance capability, satisfactory work in all academic areas evidenced by transcript, satisfactory ACT and PSAT scores, and a record of active participation and enthusiastic support of musical activities and performances at high school or college. Incoming students are required to submit a letter of recommendation from his/her music teacher(s). Recipients may be enrolled full-time or part-time. Priority given to music majors and minors. Award varies. Contact Music Program.

Rosemary/Soren Munkhof Music Scholarship — Awarded to a selected sophomore, junior or senior based on academic achievement and musical talent including performances in auditions. Must be full-time. Not renewable. Award to be determined. Applications available in the Music Program.

Sackrison String — This scholarship is awarded to students with strong string and/or orchestral instrument background. The recipients must participate in the Southwest Minnesota Orchestra. An audition is required. Renewable. Maximum award of \$400. Contact Music Department.

Dr. M. Michael Suzuki Vocal Scholarship — Awards are made to full-time upperclass students majoring in music or vocal-choral music education not in their final semester. Superior vocal music performance capability, superior academic record in music coursework and satisfactory work in all academic areas as evidenced by the transcript is required. Not Renewable. Minimum award of \$500. Contact Music Department for additional scholarship criteria.

Dale Warland Choral Scholarship — Members of the SMSU Concert Choir who are enrolled full-time and eligible for this scholarship. Selection is based on their schools' performance at the Choirs of Note competition and nomination by the students' High School Choral Director. Renewable. Minimum award of \$500. Contact Director of SMSU Choral Activities.

PHYSICS

SMSU Physics Program Endowment — Physics majors are eligible for this award. Selection is based on academic performance with the Physics Program. Must be full-time. Financial need is not a factor. Contact the Physics Department.

POLITICAL SCIENCE

Ethel and Joseph Amato, Sr. Memorial Scholarship — See History Scholarship Listing.

John Zwach Endowment for the Study of Local Government — Students must submit an essay on issues confronting local governmental units or rural issues in southwest Minnesota. Recipient must show leadership and/or participation in addressing an issue confronting local governments. Renewable. Award of \$300 to \$1,000. Contact Political Science Program for further information.

PSYCHOLOGY

Cowan Scholarship — Scholarship recipient must be a woman entering junior or senior year and majoring in psychology. Must have proven leadership and have a minimum grade point average of 2.9. Financial need is not a factor. Contact the Psychology Program.

Psychology Program Scholarship — Psychology majors who will be junior standing or higher at the beginning of the following academic year are eligible for this scholarship. Cumulative grade point average of 3.0 and at least a B in any given course within the major are required. Full-time or part-time students completing a minimum of 6 credits per semester will be considered. Not renewable. Minimum scholarship of \$500. Contact Psychology Program.

Nick Roberts Memorial Scholarship — See History Scholarship Listing.

SOCIOLOGY/ANTHROPOLOGY

Sociology/Anthropology Scholarship — Recipients shall be SMSU students who are majoring in the Sociology, Anthropology Program and who have completed 20 credits or more in their respective major. Must have cumulative grade point average of 3.0 and at least a B in any given course within the major. Full-time or part-time. Award of \$500. Contact Sociology/Anthropology Program.

Robert White Memorial Scholarship — Awarded to returning sophomore, junior or senior student majoring in sociology or social work who has a personal commitment to issues of social justice and who has demonstrated that commitment through social activism. Financial need is not a factor. Preference given to full-time students. Contact Sociology/Anthropology Program.

SPEECH COMMUNICATION

Richard A. Baun Memorial Radio and Television Scholarship — Awarded to new or continuing students majoring in Speech Communications/Radio and Television. New students must have a high school average of B or above and must have demonstrated interest in radio and television at the high school level. Continuing students must have been enrolled at least one year at SMSU, maintain a cumulative 3.0 grade point average, and be active in Radio-TV activities. Award varies. Contact Speech Communication Program.

Fine Arts Gala Scholarship — See Art Scholarship Listing.

SMSU Speech Communication and Forensics Scholarship — Awarded to new and/or continuing SMSU students who have demonstrated excellence in forensics and competitive speaking activities. Continuing students must have at least a 2.8 grade point average. Award varies. Contact the Chairperson of the Art, Music, Speech Communication and Theatre Department.

THEATRE

Fine Arts Gala Scholarship — See Art Scholarship Listing.

SMSU Theatre Scholarship — Awarded to new and/or continuing SMSU students who have demonstrated excellence in any area of theatre or speech/theatre. Continuing students must have at least a 3.0 grade point average. Award varies. Contact the Chairperson of the Art, Music, Speech Communication and Theatre Department.

William and Norma Hezlep Theatre Award — This scholarship is awarded to an outstanding theatre arts student as determined by the SMSU Theatre faculty. Not renewable. Minimum award of \$500. Contact Theatre Department.

FINANCIAL NEED-BASED

SCHOLARSHIPS

(The FAFSA application must be completed and processed by March 1).

Charles and Ellora Alliss Educational Foundation Scholarship — Awarded on the basis of academic ability and financial need. Must be full-time. New and continuing students are eligible. 1-year award. Renewable. Applications are required each year. Award varies. Continuing SMSU Student scholarship application available at the Financial Aid Office.

Bush Memorial Scholarship — Awarded to upperclass students with demonstrated academic achievement and financial need. Priority given to Yellow Medicine and Chippewa County residents, but scholarships may be awarded to other students if need, achievement and potential for success criteria are not met by applications from priority counties. Renewable. Annual award of \$500. Contact Financial Aid Office for Continuing SMSU Student scholarship application.

Trustee Emeritus Erickson Part-time Student Scholarship — Scholarship awarded to working adult students who are enrolled in 1 to 11 credits. Preference will be given to students who are working full- or part-time. Must demonstrate financial need and be in good academic standing. Award of \$100. Complete Continuing SMSU Undergraduate Student Scholarship Application and submit to Financial Aid Office.

Roger Green Memorial Scholarship — Awarded to a deserving full or part-time student who has demonstrated financial need. Not renewable. Award to be determined. Complete Continuing SMSU Undergraduate Student Scholarship Application.

Powell Family Scholarship — Awarded to a person who desires to return to undergraduate study and earn a bachelor's degree. Recipient must be enrolled for 12 or more credit hours each quarter. Sophomore, junior or senior standing required. Financial need must be demonstrated. Renewable if student maintains a 2.0 cumulative grade point average. Annual award to be determined. Continuing SMSU Student scholarship application available at the Financial Aid Office.

Alice Reed Memorial Bookstore Corral Scholarship — Recipients must be a sophomore, junior or senior with a grade point average of 2.5 - 3.5. Must not be receiving athletic scholarships. Preference given to full-time students. Based on financial need. Continuing SMSU Student scholarship application available at the Financial Aid Office.

Weiner Scholarship Fund — Scholarship awarded to an academically outstanding student based on past year's performance. Financial need is a factor. Two awards of \$500. Continuing SMSU Student scholarship application available at the Financial Aid Office.

MERIT SCHOLARSHIPS

Emerging Student Scholarship — Awarded to students that have shown a commitment to academic success, university activities, and community service. Priority will be given to students that have established participation in university activities, community service, excelled academically and are actively employed while attending SMSU. Financial need is not a factor. Award varies. Continuing SMSU Student scholarship application available at the Financial Aid Office.

Lillian Mellenthin Endowed Scholarship — Recipients must be continuing students at SMSU who have demonstrated a commitment to academic success. Renewable for up to three years. Minimum award of \$500. Continuing SMSU Student scholarship application available at the Financial Aid Office.

Viking Coca-Cola — This scholarship is awarded to continuing full-time students. It is based on academic and leadership performance. Minimum award of \$1,000. Not renewable. Complete Continuing SMSU Undergraduate Student Scholarship Application and submit to Financial Aid Office.

RESTRICTED SCHOLARSHIPS

American Legion Post #113 Scholarship — Selection based on academic performance and demonstrated leadership ability. Based on recommendation from the American Legion Post #113. Preference given to incoming freshman. Financial need is not a factor. Renewable. Students must reapply. Minimum award of \$500. New students should contact the Admissions Office. Continuing students must complete the Continuing SMSU Student scholarship application available at the Financial Aid Office.

Shelly Bjerke Memorial Scholarship — Scholarships awarded to freshmen and sophomores from Clear Lake, South Dakota. Student must have a 3.0 grade point average. Financial need is not a factor. Freshmen should contact the Admission Office and upperclass students complete the Continuing SMSU Student Scholarship Application available in the Financial Aid Office.

Thomas Drever Sr. Family Memorial Scholarship — Awarded to incoming freshmen or upperclass students who graduated from Tracy High School. Incoming freshmen must be in the upper one-half of his/ her graduating class. SMSU upperclassmen must be enrolled full-time and have a cumulative grade point average of at least 2.5. Annual award is a minimum of \$800, up to but not exceeding the cost of tuition and fees for the year. Financial need not a factor. Continuing SMSU Student scholarship application available at the Financial Aid Office.

Heartland Consumer Power District Scholarship — Awarded to students whose parents receive electric service from Heartland Consumer Power District. Not based on financial need. Contact Financial Aid Office. Continuing SMSU Student scholarship application.

International Student Success Scholarship — Awarded to a sophomore international student who is enrolled full-time. The student must be in good academic standing with a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.5. Minimum award of \$500. Continuing SMSU Student Scholarship applications are available at the Financial Aid Office.

Marshall Independent Newspaper Scholarship — Scholarship awarded to a SMSU student that has contributed time and effort to the writing and publishing of the SMSU *Spur* for at least one year. Awarded on the recommendation of the *Spur* faculty advisor. Financial need not a factor. Award of \$600. Contact *Spur* Student Newspaper Office.

Vernon and Frances M. Runholt Endowed Scholarship — Scholarship awarded to junior or senior who did not enter the University as a scholarship recipient, but who has performed well above expectations academically and/or in a position of student leadership. Consideration will be given to persons served by the Learning Resource Center. Minimum award of \$500. This scholarship is not renewable. Financial need not a factor. Must complete Continuing SMSU Student scholarship application available at the Financial Aid Office.

Oscar/Cora Sather Endowed Scholarship — Recipients shall be Native Americans who can verify American Indian lineage through a federally-recognized tribe. Must complete Free Application for Federal Student Aid. Must be enrolled full-time. Award to be determined. Renewable. Students must maintain a cumulative grade point average of 2.0 or better. Application available at the Financial Aid Office.

SMSUFA Scholarship — Student must be enrolled full-time and maintain a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.25. Financial need is not a factor. Contact the Faculty Association.

SMSU Residence Hall Association Distinguished Resident Scholarship — Awarded to a student who lives in the residence halls and has a minimum GPA of 2.25. Current Residence Hall Association members and Residential Life staff are not eligible to receive award. Must complete scholarship application. Minimum award of \$500. Contact SMSU Residence Hall Association.

Veterans of Foreign Wars Post 742 of Marshall Endowed Scholarship — Preference is given to members of VFW Post 742 and/or their dependents. Preference is given to an incoming freshman. The award is based on academic performance and demonstrated leadership ability with a recommendation from VFW Post 742. Students must re-apply. Minimum award of \$500.
