3. Debrief Midpoint Roundtable – Notes: Project Version 5.0 update due November 12th. Student affairs is looking good. Progress was made on gap analysis. Program status letters were reviewed. Processes were discussed regarding future assessment reports. A Qualtrics survey will be sent out to programs to help determine where programs are actually assessing the LEP outcomes. A good presentation on the difference between Assessment OF Learning versus Assessment FOR Learning.

4. Update PASL (Pam/Betsy/Ben) – A recommendation that the updated PASL can be included as a session at the Professional Development Day. Process- AAT originates the document, CIA vets, roll-out at January Professional Development Day presented by CIA. Notes: The PASL does not explicitly state that the plan should include assessment of programmatic SLOs and LEP SLOs. Language should be included in the PASL to include SLOs for Programmatic Goals and LEP Goals in each course's syllabus. Also, language should be added to syllabi to state if any artifacts from that course will be used for assessment and if so, which SLOs. A discussion over whether key performance indicators such as "students will: " statements.
