

The Teacher Education Assistance for College and Higher Education (TEACH) Grant Program provides up to \$4,000 per year in grants for some graduate students and a few undergraduate students who intend to **teach** <u>high</u> <u>need subject matter</u> as a full-time teacher for at least **four years** at a **school that serves students from lowincome** <u>families</u>

You must plan to teach **high-need** subject matter (Math, Sciences, World Languages, ESL, Special ED) or teach in a high need area facing a teacher shortage in your state of employment. To check on whether or not your current or planned field is on your state's teacher shortage area, you may want to check the Dept. of Education's website at https://tsa.ed.gov to view the report.

You also need to agree to teach at a school serving low-income students for at least four of the eight years following graduation or ceasing your program of study. Your school or Educational Service Agency must be listed on the Department of Education's *Annual Directory of Designated Low Income Schools* located at https://studentaid.gov/tcli/directory-search

To be eligible to apply you must be degree seeking (students in liscensure or certificates programs, only, are not eligible) and meet the following academic achievement requirements:

- ✓ Have a cumulative GPA of at least a 3.25 after your most recent completed semester;
- ✓ Certain Graduate students who are current teachers or retirees from another occupation with expertise in a field where there is a shortage of teachers.

Other Requirements

- Be a citizen or eligible non-citizen.
- Not in default on a federal student loan.
- Meet the Standards for Financial Aid Satisfactory Academic Progress.
- Complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) located at <u>www.studentaid.gov</u> (you do not have to demonstrate financial need).

If you fail to complete the 4 year teaching obligation within 8 years of completing or leaving your program of study, your grant will convert to an unsubsidized loan which will have to be repaid with interest accrued from the date the grant funds were first disbursed.

If you are selected to receive a TEACH Grant, EACH year you will need to:

- Complete TEACH Grant Counseling (www.studentaid.gov, under the "Complete Ald Process" and "Complete TEACH Grant Counseling and Agreement to Serve" tabs/links)
- Complete and sign the Agreement to Serve (ATS) (www.studentaid.gov, under the "Complete Ald Process" and "Complete TEACH Grant Counseling and Agreement to Serve" tabs/links)
- Maintain a minimum cumulative GPA of 3.25 EACH semester
