

Dear School Administrators,

Southwest Minnesota State University is very excited to share with you that we have SPED, TESL, and ELED Residency teacher licensure programs. We admit new cohorts of candidates each fall and encourage you to include any potential candidates who are working as paraprofessionals in your districts. Here are the main things to know about these programs:

- 1) Candidates are working toward their bachelor's degree and licensure in one of 3 areas:
  - a. SPED-ABS licensure which allows special education teachers to work with students with special needs in the areas of autism (ASD), learning disabilities (LD), emotional/behavioral disorders (EBD), developmental disabilities (DD), and other health impairments (OHD) at the mild-to-moderate levels.

- b. TESL licensure which allows teachers to work with English learners/multilingual learners in K-12.
- c. ELED licensure which allows teachers to work with K-6 elementary learners.
- 2) The programs are offered in a fully online format.
- 3) Candidates must meet the following qualifications:
  - a. Have completed an A.A. degree and/or the MnTC goal areas or a previous bachelor's degree from an accredited institution;
  - b. Currently working as a paraprofessional;
  - c. Signed Administrative Consent to Participate in the Program (form provided)
  - d. Required application and signatures must be submitted by August 1 prior to fall enrollment.

We have found that several of the candidates may apply without having the MnTC goal areas completed. This means that they likely have general education courses yet to take to earn a bachelor's degree. If you have paraprofessionals in this position, we would be able to assist candidates in the completion of the MnTC requirements prior to enrolling them into the program. These programs are designed for working paraprofessionals. Candidates would work through the residency program over the course of three years, including student teaching. Candidates will need to meet requirements for admission to SMSU's Teacher Preparation Program by the end of the first year of courses. Please reference the SMSU School of Education website for the most current admission requirements.

Candidates can continue in their positions while taking coursework and during student teaching; student teaching is a year-long mentorship for half days and can be completed in the district/buildings where they are employed if the necessary grade bands and settings can be met. Candidates will need some flexibility in their positions to complete field experiences in the PELSB required grade bands (K-4, 5-8, & 9-12) for their coursework and during student teaching. Ideally, candidates will be assigned paraprofessional duties in classrooms that correspond with the clinical experiences needed for the semester. This allows for the paraprofessional to complete the needed clinical experiences with minimal disruptions to their paraprofessional duties.

All clinical experiences will need to be fulfilled under the supervision of a Tier 3 or 4 licensed educator. The required field experiences along with grade bands requirements are listed on the following pages, along with an Administrative Consent Form for your paraprofessionals to enroll in the program.

If you have candidates interested in being part of this innovative program, here are their next steps:

- 1) Have open discussions as to whether the program is the right fit for the candidate and your district.
- 2) The candidate should complete the e-form application on the SMSU School of Education website.
- 3) Attach the Administrative Consent Form to the application and keep a copy for your records.
- 4) Support the candidate through flexible scheduling to complete required clinical experiences.

As SPED-ABS works with students identified as mild-to-moderate, a setting IV or above will <u>not</u> be accepted for field experiences or student teaching. <u>Candidates will need some flexibility in their positions</u> in order to complete field experiences in the PELSB required grade bands (K-4, 5-8, & 9-12) for their coursework and during student teaching. **\*NOTE-this list does not include additional required courses without field experiences**
