

## **RN to BSN Program Full-Time Program of Study (uAchieve Student Planner)**

The SMSU RN to BSN Program is committed to meeting the needs of our diverse student body. Flexibility is a key need for our student body; thus, flexibility is found throughout the program, beginning with the admission process through the curriculum. To set students up for success, courses are sequenced in this manner. Students may progress at a full-time or slower pace (less than full-time) to meet Department of Nursing requirements and their personal and professional needs. The program of study includes all prerequisite courses, Minnesota Transfer (MnTC) Curriculum core courses, and nursing courses required to complete the degree.

**Full-time (FT) Length of Program:** The Department of Nursing (RN-BSN Program) defines FT students to complete program requirements in four (4) semesters/Fall and Spring, start to finish, with summer courses *optional*. This includes the total number of academic terms to complete the program (including any [MnTC Curriculum](#)). The RN-BSN Program is a 30-credit hour program with 10 core nursing courses, along with a choice of one (1) nursing elective: Care of the Rural Population (NURS 434), Clinical Reasoning and Judgment (NURS 435), or Mental Health Nursing (NURS 437).

**RN to BSN Program Less Than Full-Time (Part-Time) Program of Study (uAchieve Student Planner)**

**Less Than Full-time:** Part-time students complete coursework in up to 14 semesters (seven years), including Fall and Spring (with summer being *optional*). Students must complete the SMSU RN to BSN Program within a seven-year timeframe. Students can also complete one course per Fall and Spring semesters adhering to the same sequence of working with their faculty advisor.

**\*Courses with prerequisites**

Students may begin the RN to BSN Program NURS courses in the fall or spring semester. The RN to BSN program at Southwest Minnesota State University (SMSU) is a 30-credit hour program with 10 courses and one elective course. The three programs of study above are just some examples of programs of study available. Standard 16-week (as displayed above) and express course options (8 to 10-week courses) are available.

Flexibility is offered in scheduling courses to meet student learner needs, noting that SMSU may not offer all courses per schedule, depending on enrollment. Students may take courses at a pace that meets their needs, ranging from taking one course at a time to taking courses full-time. Summer course offerings are available/optional if desired. Students may change the pace at which they take courses while in the program. Students are encouraged to review the course catalog for each semester's offerings. Beyond the RN to BSN Program courses, additional courses may be needed to complete the Liberal Education Program (LEP) Minnesota Transfer Curriculum (MnTC) SMSU graduation requirements. SMSU baccalaureate degree completion requirements include 120-semester credits, including 42 MnTC credits. MnTC includes general education courses reflecting competencies adopted by the higher education entities of Minnesota. To complete the entire MnTC at SMSU, students must earn at least 40-42 credits in the ten goal areas and the requirements for each goal area. Successful completion of the National Council Licensure Examination (NCLEX) earns 15 credits for prior learning. The student academic advisor will help the student create their program of study to progress through the program, with each student having a unique, individualized course program of study. Additionally, some RN to BSN students transfer into the program with all LEP MnTC credits met.
