Special Education: Emotional Behavioral Disorder (EBD) Birth-Age 21 Licensure Post-Bacc Level

Additional Teaching License

The SPED: EBD program leading to licensure is available to candidates who already hold a Minnesota teaching license, Tier 3 or 4, and seek additional licensing in EBD. This program will facilitate the current needs of teachers seeking Minnesota licensure in the area of Emotional Behavioral Disorders.

If candidate holds a SPED:ABS license, the Special Education Core may already have been met. A comprehensive transcript review will verify courses needed for Minnesota licensure requirements.
