As a reminder to International Students, you must enroll full-time to maintain visa status (12 credits min. for undergraduates, 6 credits min. for graduates). The US Fed Regulations will only allow one online course, up to 3 credits, to count towards your full-time requirement. Check in with ISSGS if you have any questions.


