Your **International Passport** must always be valid (not expired) while you are in the US. Please remember to renew your passport at least 6 months before it expires to avoid any complications. Check your passport TODAY to see when it expires!

Next issue: Apply for your Real ID (enforced from Oct 30, 2020) for travel (US domestic flights).

Coronavirus/Coavid-19 Virus
